In 2023, the Cincinnati & Hamilton County Public Library continued to offer welcoming spaces where community members can meet, read, work, learn, create, and connect at our 41 locations. From our cozy fireplaces to our spacious meeting rooms, the public library is a gathering space for all.

The Library is a public space where our dedicated staff help community members find books and materials, build workforce development and technology skills, support small businesses and entrepreneurs, and provide life-long learning opportunities for everyone. Our staff also help young Ohioans build early literacy skills, succeed in school, and prepare for college, careers, and life. We host thousands of storytimes each year as well as deliver monthly collections of books to dozens of schools and daycares.

In 2023, the Library's Building the Next Generation Library initiative's completed projects included our brand-new Madisonville branch, renovated and refreshed Sharonville and West End branches, and maintenance at our Corryville and Pleasant Ridge branches. We are excited for the completion of more exciting projects in 2024, including the Downtown Main Library and the Forest Park, Hyde Park, and Mt. Healthy branches.

I want to thank our community members, staff, Trustees, partners, volunteers, and donors who support the Library's pursuit of welcoming spaces, where anyone can connect, relax, learn, and thrive. We greatly appreciate your support and hope you'll read further to discover all the ways we served and supported our community in 2023!

It has been an incredible year to lead the Board of Trustees! The Library has a history of being fiscally responsible, and we have continued that legacy by controlling costs, maximizing operating dollars, and managing finances. In 2023, the Library was recognized for excellence in financial reporting by the Ohio Auditor of State's Award of Distinction and the Government Finance Officers Association's Certificate of Achievement.

The Library is committed to maintaining the high-quality experience our community members expect, and we are grateful for the support from Hamilton County residents who voted for the 10-year 1.5 mill levy on the November 2023 ballot. The Library heard from residents who agreed that CHPL should provide a high-quality experience to all and ensure excellent services and spaces for current and future generations. The levy funds will support operations, such as ensuring that staff compensation is competitive in the market and increasing spending on print and digital materials to address increased costs and to reduce wait times for popular items. Local funding is critical to our efforts to continue providing excellent library spaces, services and resources to all ages. We enjoyed seeing so many of you in our spaces this past year and hope to see you again in 2024!

Connecting to Useful Resources

EXPANDING ACCESS TO GOVERNMENT RESOURCES

After moving back home to Cincinnati, Frank came to the Groesbeck Branch Library to look for housing. Frank was living out of his truck, so Library staff recommended connecting to Hamilton County's 513 Relief Bus, which partners with CHPL. After finding the bus's schedule on the Library's **public computer with free WiFi**, Frank located a nearby shelter and connections to additional housing support.

Frank is one of more than 1,000 people who **access vital government resources** through the Library each month. CHPL connects people to childcare, food assistance, employment support, social security benefits, passport renewals, and so much more.

Encouraging Limitless Learning



BUILDING EARLY LITERACY AT STORYTIME

Four-year-old Isa and her grandmother, Irene, have been going to storytime at the Wyoming Branch Library for more than a year. At each **free, weekly storytime**, Isa makes friends, learns new words, and is taught new concepts – now, she can count to 100!

About 40% of Ohio's third graders cannot read proficiently. CHPL's storytimes are developed to close this gap by incorporating the concepts of the **Science of Reading**. Led by a Youth Librarian, storytimes provide exposure to concepts, ideas, social skills, and literacy tools critical for kids to succeed in kindergarten and beyond.

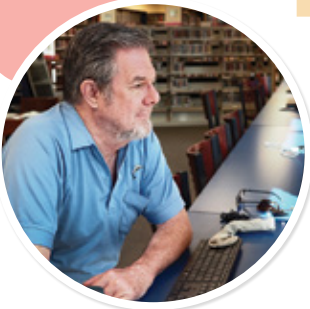

Creating Welcoming Spaces

IMPROVING THE COMMUNITY'S LIVING ROOM

Hamilton County residents have told us the Library is their **community living room**, a place to connect with others, access resources, and have fun.

CHPL's **Facility Master Plan** outlines improvements to our 41 library locations with input from more than 3,000 community members. In year five of our Facility Master Plan implementation, we continued investing in inclusive and accessible spaces so the Library can truly be welcoming to all.

Madisonville Branch Library relocated and nearly doubled interior space, adding maker equipment, a large community room, and study pods.

West End Branch Library saw upgraded interior space, adding study pods, and improving accessibility for the building's entrance and restrooms.

Sharonville Branch Library has a refreshed interior: an expanded children's area, dedicated teen area, and quiet reading area with cozy fireplace.

Pleasant Ridge Branch Library's updated interior includes a quiet room and improved technology. The project also included critical upgrades to the branch's roof and other infrastructure.

Corryville Branch Library's updated interior has welcoming spaces for children, teens, and adults. The project also included critical upgrades to the branch's windows and foundation.
